

This draft is the preliminary work product of a three-year task force of laypeople from various occupations as well as rostered ministers. Pastor Lois is willing to facilitate a discussion on it during July or August. Please contact her if you are interested in participating, indicating what day(s) of the week and time(s) of day would work best for you.

ELCA social statements are teaching documents that provide broad frameworks to assist us in thinking about social issues in the context of faith and life. They are meant to help communities and individuals with moral formation and thoughtful engagement with current social issues as we participate in God's work in the world. Social statements also set policy for the ELCA, guiding its advocacy and work as a publicly engaged church. They result from an extensive process of participation and deliberation; each statement is subject to adoption by a two-thirds vote of an ELCA churchwide assembly.



## **PEACE**

When I attended the PEACE meeting at Resurrection Catholic Church in Lakeland, it was a real eye opener. I learned that 184,000 seniors in Polk County want to live independently in their own homes, but they don't have the resources to support themselves. I also learned that around 45,000 seniors in Polk County live in poverty. That's 1 in 5. In 2023, over 3,200 seniors were on a waiting list for community based services.

PEACE wants a Basic Care Plan that is provided at the county level to serve at least 1,000 low-income seniors. This program would provide:

- Case Management
- Emergency Alert Buttons
- Home Delivered Meals
- Homemaking
- Personal Care
- ◆ In-Home respite

The cost for remaining at home is \$8,000 annually versus around \$64,000 for nursing home care.

Being a part of PEACE is an excellent opportunity for us as a church to make a difference in Polk County for those who badly need our help.



## TREASURE FOR GOD (SUMMER STEWARDSHIP – PART THREE)



Please "be on the look-out" for six-month statements in July. Your stewardship committee hopes this information will help you stay ontrack with your intended financial support to Reformation Lutheran Church during 2024.

Giving tends to drop-off during the summer months while "snowbirds" are away and full-time residents either travel or entertain visitors. Due to our ongoing ministries (see the "treasure" article in last month's newsletter), however, our expenses do not. Here are some ways you can stabilize or improve summer giving:

- Automate your regular offering by using your bank's bill-paying service or Reformation's online (Vanco) giving page.
- Make the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your IRA as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) to Reformation now instead of waiting until the end of the year.
- Every time you treat yourself to your favorite pleasure (an ice cream cone, a fancy coffee, a mani-pedi, or whatever), set-aside an extra donation for the same amount.
- Look-through your unused gift cards and donate any that the congregation could use for fellowship, property, or office purchases.
- Make a modest donation to celebrate another member's summer birthday or in honor of their talent contributions to the congregation.

# LUTHERANISM 101: PENTECOST (CONTINUED)

Ordinary Time – the Longest season in the Iturgical Year



Christmas and Easter are seasons of the church, not just one day on the church calendar. Pentecost, the third major festival of the church, is different.

As we covered in one of last month's "Lutheranism 101" articles, the Day of Pentecost takes place at the conclusion of the 50-day season of Easter. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the followers of Jesus who were gathered in Jerusalem as described in Acts 2:1–31.

You will sometimes hear the extended period between the Day of Pentecost and the relatively minor festival day of Christ the King (which occurs the Sunday before Advent starts) referred to as Pentecost. That, however, is "short hand" for the actual name of the season: "the Season After Pentecost" (or, in some faith traditions, "Ordinary Time"). This means when you see "2 Pentecost" or "Pentecost 2" in a bulletin or other church document, the full name for the day is "the Second Sunday after Pentecost."

During the Season after Pentecost, the paraments (color-coded linens on the altar, pulpit, and elsewhere) are green. In many churches, the liturgical setting is changed for the season; for example, we have changed to Setting #8 from Evangelical Lutheran Worship (the cranberry-colored hymnal). Also, if the Nicene Creed had been in use, the weekly confession of faith might switch to the more ordinary Apostles Creed.

### **BATTERED WOMEN'S SHELTER**

The loss of our annual yard sale has caused a dilemma for many of our ladies. Some of us looked forward to the annual yard sale to go through our closets and purge those garments that were still good, but we were just tired of wearing them or they were slightly out of style, or our bodies had changed shapes here and there. It has been a struggle finding places where we can dispose of this clothing short of



throwing them away. At last week's outreach meeting we talked about donating this usable clothing to **Peace River Battered Women's Shelter** in Lakeland. I contacted the Shelter, and they can use any women's clothing, including shoes. Effective immediately there will be a large box in the "collection room" designed to receive your donations. An exception is new underwear only; slightly worn bras are ok. Remember, many of these women arrive at the shelter with only the clothes on their backs.

## **WOULD YOU CONSIDER?**

Pastor Lois has tasked each council member with finding a backup. I am not only a council member, but I am also the treasurer for Reformation, so I need to find someone who can learn what I do as the treasurer in case something unexpected should happen to me. You do not need to be a mathematician or a bookkeeper or an accountant. You do need to be responsible, reliable, and computer literate. We use Power Church, a church management software, which makes the job much easier. I do the church's financials on my home computer so I can do it at a time that is convenient for me. After the books close for the month, I update the church's computer so that there is always a backup copy of the records, just one month behind. I am in the process of updating the treasurer's procedures which are very detailed.

I would love to chat with you if you are interested and try to answer any questions and concerns you may have. If after church is not convenient for you, I am free most any time. Please give it consideration.
